Last autumn, while working on a **concrete timbre** project, Ann Warren and Nancy Greening formalized a sister organization and initiated **d'moiselles**. After many months of planning and organizing we are proud to say...

Welcome to Trifles & 1905 Wife, d'moiselles premiere project!

Nancy Greening has been thinking about presenting Susan Glaspell's *Trifles* for a long time. During her research, she found the very interesting article *1905 Wife* by an anonymous farm wife that was published by Hamilton Holt. To put these two turn of the century writings together, she wrote an introduction and turned the article into an interview. After long discussions, Nancy and Ann realized that the first project was underway!

The next step was to assemble a fantastic design and technical team. We are very lucky! Our team is talented and supportive. So, we thank Bethany Briggs who stepped up immediately to be the Production Stage Manager, Robert Morton from concrete timbre who joined to do the projections, Catherine Siracusa who worked diligently to create costumes to reflect the turn of the century, and Gillian Koch who created the light to make these shows shine.

Then to bring the characters to life, five exceptional actors created the cast. As Mrs. Hale, Sally Connors brings humanity and compassion. First as Susan Glaspell, then as Mrs. Peters and finally as the 1905 Wife, Melinda Graham shines as a turn-of-the-20th-century woman. As Sheriff Henry Peters, David A. Green disregards a woman's fascination with trifles but then as Hamilton Holt finds the dignity in a farm wife's life. As Mr. Hale, James Hamblin recounts the frightful day of learning about his neighbor's death and then as the 1905 Husband portrays a man wrestling with his wife's talent. Finally, as County Attorney Henderson, Seth Ruffer looks for clues and meaning in the life and death on a midwestern farm. Again, we want to express our gratitude for this exceptional cast sharing their talent.

d'moiselles intends to present several new projects in the future. Note the emphasis on projects. We want projects that women can work on together, but we don't exclude men. And, it's not about content - we don't limit the subject matter of our projects. We want compelling stories told in an interesting way. Sure we're interested in projects about women, but that is not the goal. The goal is to get more woman artists working!

Director's Q&A

When did Trifles take place? It was based on an event in 1900 and it was written in 1916. I imagine Glaspell didn't have a particular year in mind but I think of it as happening about 1900.

From what did you adapt 1905 Wife? A beautiful autobiographical essay by an anonymous farm wife published first in 1905 by Hamilton Holt. Every word spoken by our 1905 Wife is directly from that original essay written more than a century ago. Hamilton Holt's words are the only words I added. So, you wrote an Introduction to Trifles. Where does the play Trifles begin? Susan Glaspell's play *Trifles* begins right after Sheriff Peters in the Introduction says, "It should be warmer inside."

Did Susan Glaspell say any of those things really? Not as far as I know, except she is quoted as once saying (in front of an enthusiastic theater audience) "I'm so glad you liked my little play."
