

Jacqui Anscombe enjoys learning something new, every day.

**Beatriz García Barreto** is a communicologist focused on audiovisual arts and is a spontaneous verse maker from time to time. Amused by all the possibilities found in music technology, I spend the day making beats and rhythms with baby toys or whatever is at hand, and my nights studying languages (my main inspiration). Mr. **Lucas Bass** lives mostly inside his head. His head is in the clouds. The clouds have all gone and its a radiant, clear blue sky.

**BitterSuite** creates multi-sensory concerts for classical music and contemporary music, using the sensory experience to deepen the experience of listening. The process is inspired by cross-modal perception and graphic notation.

**Morell Cutler** is an artist drawn to bold and spirited representations of reality. He is a studied painter, actor and culinary wizard. He is best known as a sparkling nuisance but welcomes a wild mood swing, as long as he is on the playground.

**Chris Danforth** I gather inspiration wherever I find it: here a toy piano, there a box of reel-to-reel tapes. With the onset of digital voicemail, answering machines, and their message-filled tapes, began to appear in thrift stores, and to make their way into my compositions.

**Emma DeGrand** strives daily to be as sensitive as possible. Friends would describe them as "lovably eccentric," "an odd, friendly little guy," and "not creepy at all." In their spare time, they play Dungeons and Dragons.

Melinda Faylor pianist with a flair for the ambitious.

Kai Fin used to play the horn, and from this developed an interest in thorny reactions to timbre, particularly in terms of disgust, pleasure, and disorientation. Kai also tends to get excited about soft robots, old wind instruments, and the sound of footsteps.

Whitney George is a composer and conductor who specializes in the use of mixed media to blur the distinctions between concert performance, installation art, and theater. Utilizing a wide variety of material including literary texts, silent film, stock footage, and visual arts, George's compositions are characterized by an immersive theatricality that thrives on collaboration in all phases of the creative process. Her affinity for the macabre, the fantastic, and the bizarre frequently gives rise to musical programs that evoke the traditions of phantasmagoria and melodrama, challenging musicians to experiment liberally with their stage personae, and audiences to widen the scope of their attention.

**David A. Green** is an actor, musician, travel agent and overall Renaissance man, treading the streets of New York for almost 30 years. He loves a good meal and a good joke. He is a huge fan of theater, opera and an open faced roast beef sandwich. When the fat lady finally sings, he wants to be surrounded by loved ones and dressed in glitter and chiffon.

**Bong-chae Jeong** I am a photographer living WUPO in Korea. This area is a wetland with many kinds of living creatures. My photos are results of my looking at them from morning to night, through every season. All the creatures are dancing, waving, singing before me. Sometimes I feel that I am they, they are I. Alexander Vladigerov (1933-1993) was the son of the acclaimed Bulgarian-Jewish composer Pancho Vladigerov (1899-1978). This piano work, written in 1954, features 9 variations using variety of traditional Bulgarian asymmetrical rhythms combined with modern jazzy harmonies, dynamic build ups and virtuosic technics.


